second Friday of every month.

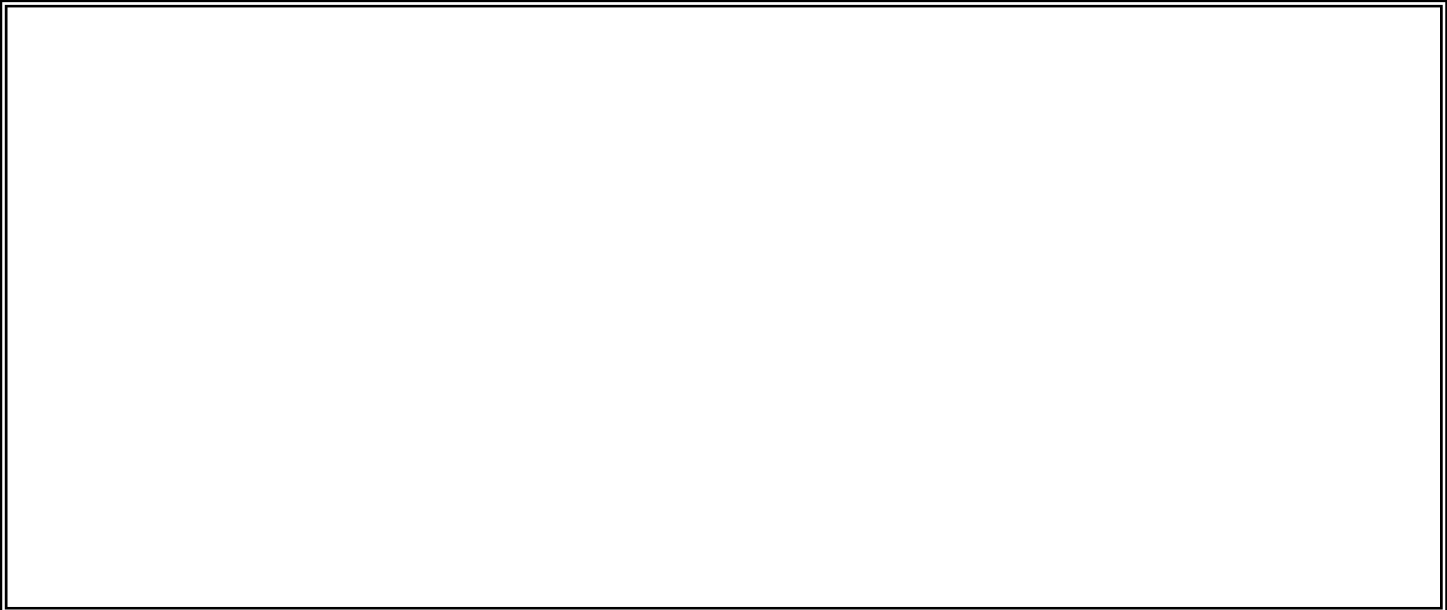

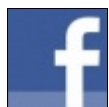
